

## **CENTENARY PROGRAMME**

The year 2018 is an important and significant one as South Africa, and the world, celebrate 100 years of Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela. The Mandela Centenary Year will see heightened efforts to mark the life, times and legacy of a man who dedicated his life in service to his people and country.

Nelson Mandela University marks this milestone with a yearlong Centenary Celebration Programme, which will see a series of institution-wide activities planned and championed by its seven faculties, along with other University entities, that essentially speak to the various aspects of Mandela's legacy.
